As many of you know we used to have an annual Kayak and Canoe trip down the White Oak River. We are planning one again this year if we have enough interest. This has always been a fun family outing for our Harvest family. We will start at Haywood landing for those that want to do 7 miles. If that is too long we will meet you at Long Point Landing which is a shorter trip. That way we can all end up at the Stella Bridge together. The White Oak River runs through the Croatan forest and is a beautiful winding ride. We will have our boat and travel along with the kayaks and canoes should anyone have trouble. North Carolina requires life vests for each individual onboard. Children 13 and under are required to wear them.

If you don't have a kayak or canoe you can rent them on base or other places in the area. We suggest you bring plenty of water and sunscreen.
